GMC wins division title! Pat Heise - 1, Others - 0

SCHENECTADY - March 19 — For the first time since the merging of divisions in 1992, Burlington's **Green Mountain Chorus**, under the direction of Assistant Director Pat Heise, has won the Mountain Division Chorus title beating six choruses including arch-rival Saratoga Spring's **Racing City Chorus**.

It should be noted that this contest marks the first time the GMC has ever beaten Saratoga on fair terms since the GMC returned to the competition arena in 1969. While GMC placed higher than Saratoga in Portland in 1996, in fact, that year Saratoga lost to us as they did not perform up to even a reasonable standard in that contest.

In addition, GMC's score met the previous goal of scoring in the mid-sixties by achieving an average score per judge, per song of 65.7 compared with Saratoga's 64.8.

Saratoga in second place, with Schenectady in third and Pittsfield placing fourth. Greater Montréal's Island City Chorus finished a disappointing fifth. Springfield, although finishing sixth did qualify, along with the above five, for the Northeastern

District's Fall Chorus Contest to be held on October 23 in Lowell, Massachusetts.

Road Show to go to Louisville

For the fourth year in a row, Road Show has qualified to sing in the International Quartet Contest in July in Louisville, Kentucky. In each of the last three international's RS has managed to increase their placement. Although nothing to write home about, last year they were 35th.

NED's perennial contender, **Northeast Connection**, did not compete this year.

2004 will mark the 14th appearance of bass Mike Maino (Mr. Emcee) to appear on the international stage, as a contender, beginning in 1968 with the **Four Scores** with our chorus coach, Gary Bolles on baritone.

Chord Sharks win division title.

In the Division Quartet Contest, **Chord Sharks** (Pittsfield, Mass), takes the honors. Don't be confused by the score sheet, **Bourbon Street**, won last year and cannot win again.

What you missed at COTS

I was very pleased to have attended the North East District's COTS on Cape Cod. I was honored to be the Green Mountain Barbershop Chorus' delegate to the House of Delegates and to participate in the COTS. I was invited to travel with John and Carol Zweighaft and Dick Labrecque.

HOD - Met on Saturday morning. This was my second meeting with the HOD. There were 44 attending the meeting. President Alan Lamson ran the meeting. At the August 8, 2003 HOD meeting at Fitchburg State the HOD voted to change the division contest format to a regional contest format. This generated a lot of discussion and a study group by NED. As a result this HOD voted to rescind the previous August vote and adopt a new format. This new format will have conventions and contests occurring in March, April and May. These events alternate single division contests and regional contests combining to divisions to ease the costs and travel on Joe Barbershopper.

Another major item that was changed was the affiliation of the state of Rhode Island chapters [i.e. Providence and Lincoln] from the Yankee Division to the Patriot Division (with most of Massachusetts plus 3 counties in New Hampshire). A full revision of the district operating code will be published on the Society's web site in Adobe Acrobat format.

Two checks were presented to the HOD for the Young Men in Harmony by two of the chapters. There will be a special HOD meeting called to assemble in Schenectady New York on Saturday March 20th 2004. An updated copy of the Northeast District Division / District Contest Schedule was passed to the delegates.

Grant Writing - Saturday afternoon I took several hours of the Grant Writing class taught by Doug Brown and Gordon Clarke. We were very fortunate to have a class where the majority of students had a variety of grant writing experiences with their local chapters that they shared with the class. To stimulate participation Doug said, "You need a dream to have a dream come true" and asked three questions -

- What would you do if I gave you \$25,000 for your chapter?
- What would you do if I gave you \$50,000 for your chapter?
- What would you do if I gave you \$100,000 for your chapter?

That started a lively discussion packed with good ideas. I was provided a CD with the slides presented during the workshop and a *Grants Workshop Manual* from the Harmony Foundation.

The Patriots and Titan's football game overshadowed the Saturday evening afterglow.

Class - Sunday morning I took the second half of instruction for the Music Committee by David Byrne that include Standing Ovation program, Quartet support and development and Judging and Evaluation of programs. I purchased SPEBSQSA The Music Leadership Team. Of special interest are several copies of the Northeast District - A Fifty Year Review, which is a history of NED from 1945-1995. Singing in the various sessions during the weekend included: The Old Songs, Pretty Baby, I'm Forever Blowing Bubbles, Coney Island Baby and many polecats. It was a joy and a pleasure to represent the Green Mountain Barbershop Chorus, associate with all these fine songsters and learn from these men of varied experience. Thank you for this opportunity.

Alice Kruidenier 1944 - 2004

On Sunday March 28, following a valiant two year battle with colon cancer, the good Lord took Alice into his care at home in Stowe, Vermont surrounded by her family.

Alice was born in Corning, New York and held an associate degree in Music Education from Susquehanna University, Selinsgrove, Pennsylvania and a bachelor's degree in Business Administration from Trinity College in Burlington, Vermont. She was employed by IBM in Essex Junction for 13 years.

She is survived by her husband of 25 years, Greg Morrill, her daughter, Laura (Nichols) Winters and her husband Paul of Morrisville, Vermont, and her son, Curt Nichols and his wife Joanne, of Gorham, Maine; as well as Curtis Nichols, father of her children. She is also survived by three grandchildren and a brother.

Since moving to Vermont in 1969, she was constantly involved with one of the loves of her life—music. Since moving to Chittenden County until passing on, she served local churches and their choirs, including Grace United Methodist Church in Essex Junction, the First Congregational Church in Burlington and most recently as music director at the Stowe Community Church.

For many years she was very active in her hobby, barbershop music, not only as a singer, but as co-director with husband Greg of the Champlain Echoes and took them to International Chorus Championships in 1986, 1990 and 1992, when complications of chronic fatigue syndrome restricted her activities. As a singer she sang in the quartet **Expressions** with Carol Hathaway, Nancy L'Ecuyer and Irene Knight, and in **Burlington Beat** with Vicki Ferris, Carol Hollenbeck and Nancy L'Ecuyer. She also served as the emcee for several of the joint Holiday Concerts sponsored by the Champlain Echoes, the Barre-Tones of Harmony, Inc. and the Burlington Chapter of the Barbershop Harmony Society, where husband Greg has been the Music Director for the last 15 years.

A celebration of Alice's life will be held in the Stowe Community Church at 11 a.m. on Saturday, April 17.
